SUBJECT: Self-Government Agreement Respecting Governance of Education

MOVED BY:WHEREAS Education is an Aboriginal and Treaty right;Chief Mikeand,Esquega,WHEREAS First Nations have, and always will have, anNationinherent right to determination and governance; and,

WHEREAS Canada wishes to act on the premise that the inherent right of self-government is an existing Aboriginal right within the meaning of Section 35 of the Constitution Act of 1982; and,

SECONDED BY:

Chief Eugene Manitowabi, Wikwemikong Unceded Nation

WHEREAS the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development is prepared to act on this premise that the inherent right of self-government includes jurisdiction in respect to education; and,

CONSENSUS

Joseph Hare Grand Council Chief **WHEREAS** the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development and the Anishinabek Chiefs wish to create specific examples of an expression of the implementation of this inherent right in respect to education; and,

WHEREAS Minister of Indian Affairs is expressing strong interest in negotiating self-government agreements across the country; and,

WHEREAS INAC is devolving its responsibilities for direct level educational services to First Nations; and,

WHEREAS the Anishinabek are desirous of exercising increased jurisdiction and self-governance over education and not merely devolution of existing INAC education programs; and,

WHEREAS there is a need for an agreement that will facilitate the regional implementation of the concept of self-government; and,

Vernon Roote Deputy Grand Council Chief **WHEREAS** the MiqMauq and the Manitoba Chiefs are currently negotiating self-government agreements; and,

WHEREAS each negotiated agreement may reduce flexibility of the future negotiations due to precedent setting constraints and formulas; and,

WHEREAS some of these agreements being negotiated have a potential for failure and could therefore negatively impact on future negotiations:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Chiefs-in-Grand Council direct the UOI Education negotiators to enter into negotiations to conclude a self government agreement respecting the governance of education that assumes complete Anishinabek jurisdiction and control over education from early childhood to secondary to postsecondary and adult education; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these negotiations be conducted with the objectives of completing an agreement by March 31, 1996, and that a full report be given to the Board of Directors for ratification; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that these negotiations and the final agreement will not prejudice in any way, the negotiations of any individual First Nation or group of First Nations on education; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing in this agreement shall abrogate or derogate from Aboriginal or Treaty rights to education and that this agreement shall be made without prejudice to the inherent right to self-determination or to subsequent self-government negotiations.

SUBJECT: Allocation of Indian Studies Support Program

SECONDED BY: WHEREAS there are currently 3 training institutes in our territory that will require regularized baseline funding in the future: Nation

WHEREAS this jurisdiction and immunity from taxation is part of the sovereignty, treaty and inherent rights of First Nations and is given expression by our government -togovernment relationship with the Crown; and,

SECONDED BY:

Chief Tom Bressette, Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point **WHEREAS** the power to raise revenues through taxation within traditional First Nations Territory is within the exclusive jurisdiction of First Nation Governments; and,

WHEREAS the Canadian and Ontario governments continue to impose their taxation systems and laws upon First Nations; and,

CONSENSUS

WHEREAS the Assembly of First Nations (AFN) has tabled a strategic plan which purposes to establish a bilateral process with Canada to resolve outstanding taxation issues facing all First Nations: and,

WHEREAS the first step in proceeding with a bilateral negotiation is to secure a moratorium on audits and assessments so as protect individuals who are currently being pursued by Revenue Canada; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Union of Ontario Indians focus their activities on an educational process through workshops and other communication to provide information on the full taxation issue and the rights of Anishinabek.

SUBJECT: Anishinabek Forestry Committee

WHEREAS the Long Term Care Reforms was initiated in 1991 and First Nations consultations took place in 1992/93 and where the Anishinabek view LTC as an immediate and a pressuring concern; and,

SECONDED BY:

Chief Bill McCue, Chippewas of Georgina Island **WHEREAS** the Anishinabek proposed amendments to Bill #173 to confirm the role of Aboriginal communities in planning, managing and delivering enhanced services for their members; and,

CONSENSUS WHEREAS Bill #173 provides an optional opportunity for First Nations to negotiate funding proposals; and,

WHEREAS First Nations recommendations and response to the provincial proposal of "Job Link" stated that it must allow for a creative and flexible options for "job creation" to be viable in all First Nation communities; and,

WHEREAS First Nations are committed to the idea of developing individual models under the Innovations Framework, which will provide an opportunity to enhance job creation, economic development, education and training; and,

WHEREAS the Anishinabek Health Commissioner has been hired by the Union of Ontario Indians Board in April 1995:

WHEREAS there are multiple funding sources, health planning and a need to coordinate First Nations health programming services and funding which flow from the Union of Ontario Indians, MSB and the Ministry of Health; and,

SECONDED BY:

Chief Eugene Manitowabi, Wikwemikong Unceded Nation **WHEREAS** it would be advisable for these computers to be compatible and capable of linking with the First Nations, tribal councils, and the Anishinabek Health Commission:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Chiefs in Grand Council direct the Anishinabek Health Director to investigate the feasibility of such a common Anishinabek computer format and that a consultant be retained to make recommendations to the Health Commission for such a system; and,

MOVED BY: Chief Tom Bressette, Chippewas of Kettle & Stony Point **WHEREAS** the Planning and Priorities Committee (PPC) delegated the Grand Chief of the Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians as the Portfolio holder for health to the Assembly of First Nations in 1990; and,

WHEREAS the Union of Ontario Indians has been concerned about the lack of reporting and communication regarding the activities and positions taken by the Ontario representative; and,

SECONDED BY:
