SUBJECT: USA FISHING CHARGES / HARVEY A. TRUDEAU / SAGAMOK ANISHINAWBEK

MOVED BY: **Chief Angus** Toulouse, Sagamok Anishnawbek WHEREAS, the Chippewa, Odawa, Potowattomi and Ojibway -- the Anishinabek traded, traveled, co-habitated since time immemorial, and most certainly prior to the creation of the Canada/USA international border; and,

WHEREAS, the Ojibways of the Sagamok Anishnawbek are descendants of Nomassin, Naguagoboe, the Chiefs of Sagamok Anishnawbek at the time of signing of the Robinson Huron Treaty.

WHEREAS, the Robinson Huron Treaty signed by the British Crown and the Chiefs of the north shore of Lake Huron from around there agreed that they "shall be permitted to hunt and fish as they have therefore been in the habit of doing".

WHEREAS, the Harvey Trudeau was charged in the United States of America (USA), by a Grand Jury in violation of sixteen USC S3372(d); and.

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chiefs in Assembly support and commend Harvey Trudeau in struggle for justice and the recognition of Aboriginal and Treaty rights in North America; and,

THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Chiefs in Assembly commit to initiate activity for the generation of revenue to assist in litigation.

SUBJECT: FIRST NATIONS' MASTERS OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM
